Dear Dr. Smith:

I am enclosing copies of our Material Information Bulletin on Ortho Paraquat Cl., and our brochure on paraquat poisoning. I hope these will be of value to you. As I mentioned on the phone, I am unaware of any effect of paraquat on the nervous system. There have been reports of brain edema seen at autopsy of patients who have ingested lethal quantities of paraquat. However, it is not known whether this is a direct effect of paraquat, or a result of the extreme condition of the patient prior to death.

Perhaps I can be of more service upon receipt of your letter.
