Hi Rob and Sabina,

You may have seen the agenda for the September 26-27 SCOPAFF meeting (link below). Ben and I just got off the phone with Wibke Meyer of CLI. She drew our attention to fact that the regulation regarding MRLs for clothianidin and thiamethoxam is on the agenda under Section B (drafts presented for an opinion) rather than Section C (drafts presented for discussion). That was a surprise for the folks in CropLife Europe, who expected to see it in Section C. They believe this means that the Commission might intend to push the regulation to a vote before third country opposition has a chance to influence Member State positions.
